Urban sociology is the study of how cities shape social life and takes the spatial context into account when trying to understand human behaviour. This course will introduce students to the core writing in the field of urban sociology and discusses different perspectives on urban and regional development. More specifically, topics will include neighbourhoods and neighbourhood effects, local social networks and communities, collective action, and immigrant and minority groups in cities. This course wil take an international approach to urban sociology, discussing literature from all over the world, including the US, Europe, and China.
